Haere rā – see you, bye, I'm staying

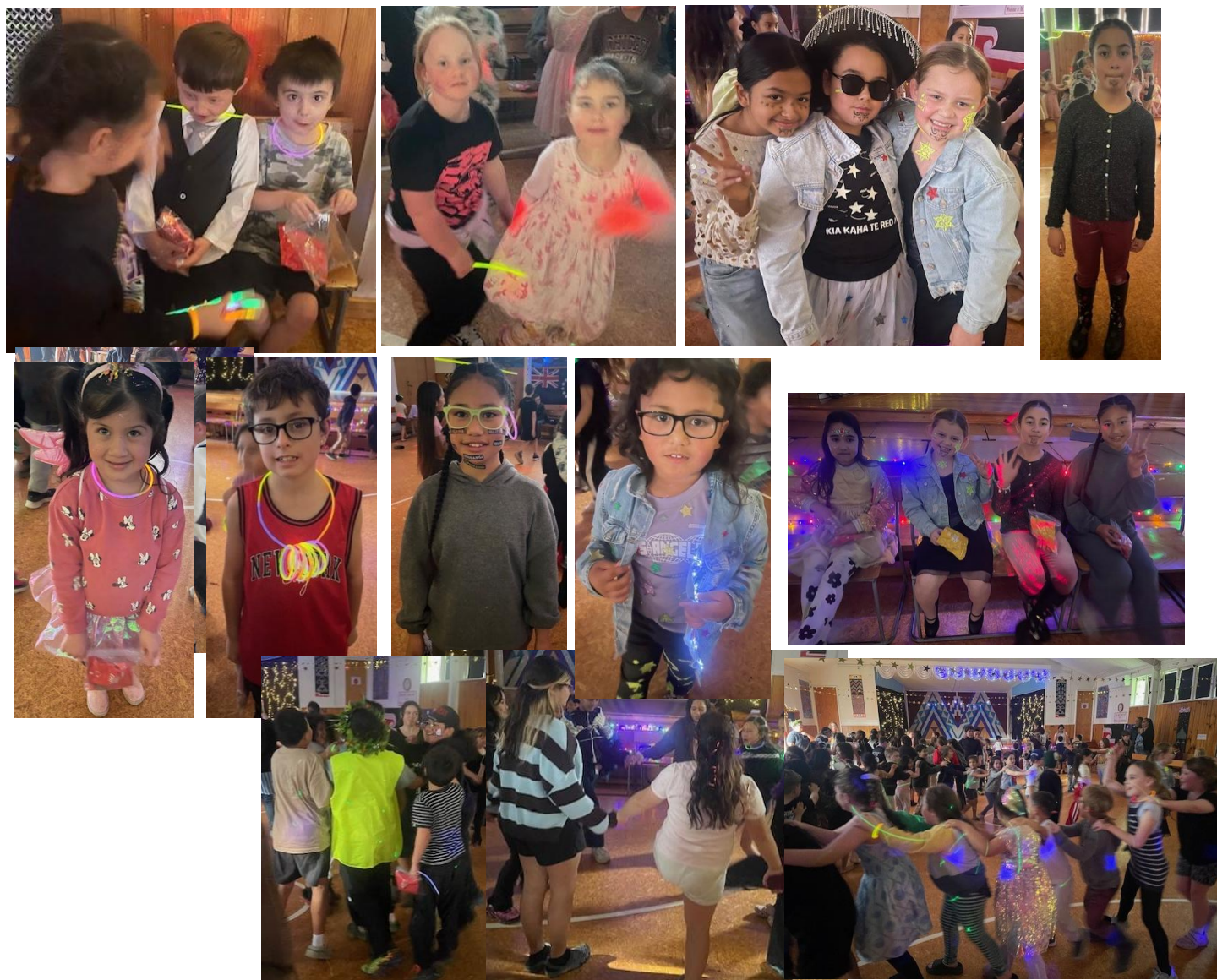
Enoho rā – see you, bye, I'm leaving
